## Beloveds of Our Saviour's,

 Every year I am amazed how early some households have their Christmas decorations up, both inside and out. It seems that as soon as Halloween is over, the Christmas lights and the inflatable Santas are brought out and their living rooms and front yards are in full Christmas mode. Now, I don't mind the carols and the beautiful decors of the Christmas season. However, I do mind the sense of being rushed and made to skip over some of the important traditions of our Christian faith, such as, All Saints Day, Christ the King Sunday, Thanksgiving celebration, and the Advent season. The way I see it, when we go from Halloween to Christmas, we're left with very little sense of anticipation and expectation, not to mention the lack of exhilaration that's to build up and lead us once again to the manger of our Savior.

Now, speaking of anticipations and expectations, there's a song in the hit Broadway show, *West Side Story*, that reminds me of the season of the Church that we're currently in – Advent. The song is entitled, "*Something's Coming*", and a few lines from it goes, "*There's somethin' due, any day; I will know, right away... ..Something's coming, something good.*" Yes, we know that the season of Advent emphasizes the sense of expectant waiting for something good to happen, to occur that will change our lives, hopefully for the better. In the Old Testament, the people of Israel had heard God's promise that someone good and mighty - a Savior - would come, and so they waited through some of the darkest hours of their nation's history for the fulfillment of that promise.

Well, for us Christians, we know that that promise was fulfilled by the coming of Jesus, some two thousand years ago in the little town of Bethlehem of Judea. And we, like the Wisemen of old, will embark “On a Road Trip” (*our Advent Sermon Series*) which we will start on Sunday, November 28<sup>th</sup> – the First Sunday of Advent. This road trip will not only lead us to celebrating the birth of our promised Savior at our one (traditional) Christmas Eve service (4:00 p.m.), but it will guide us through this new Church year with anticipations, expectations, and exhilarations.

Yes, friends and family, this Advent and Christmas seasons, and in all the seasons along our trip through 2022, I am hoping, praying, and trusting in Christ Jesus that whatever is coming, it's going to be good. I know this because God is good, all the time, and for the remainder of this year and the year to come, to expect His Goodness to abide in, around and through us.

Until then, we hope, we love, we rejoice, and we expect for His peace to abound. Yes, something is coming and it's going to be GOOD! – it's God in the flesh, Jesus.

**Mission  
Moment**

**WWJDIHWM?** Note: This guest post is by Jeremy Walloch, instructor of preaching for HarvestWorkers.net and lead pastor of Olivet Lutheran.org.

I was raised in the era of the "What Would Jesus Do?" bracelets. Anyone else? Still have yours? It's a great question, but it can be problematic. Why? Because Jesus was an unmarried, childless rabbi in the first century.

He was not a single mom. He was not a retiree. He was not a product designer, photographer, or dog groomer. He did not have a smartphone or Instagram account. So, to answer the question "What Would Jesus Do?" I do not advocate you trade in your Adidas for sandals and trade in your current career to be an itinerant preacher. So, maybe a better question is, "What Would Jesus Do If He Was Me?"

For example, Jesus was not a parent, but if he were, how might he parent? Probably with more time on the floor with the kids and less time half-listening to them while on his phone.

Jesus didn't have to go to Wal-Mart, but if he did, how might he shop? Probably less time shifting from check-out lane to check-out lane (anyone else?).

Jesus was not on social media, but if he were, how might he use it? Probably giving more hope and encouragement and less initiating arguments with people who believe differently.

When looking at our lives through this perspective, and genuinely believing that Jesus' way is The Way, it opens the door to mission not being a project of the church, a trip once a year, or an article you may or may not read, but instead we see that our entire life can be mission moments.

- Deciding between the closed Bible on the nightstand and the iPhone sitting next to it is a mission moment.
- Seeing the neighbor on the porch while your hand reaches for the garage door remote is a mission moment.
- Choosing between your Netflix queue and prayer is a mission moment.
- Selecting between your favorite music from high school and the latest song from Hillsong is a mission moment - (Have you heard "Fresh Wind"?).

In this season when so many seem wandering and confused on how now to live, knowing what we know about Jesus, how can his way of life inform yours, so that our whole lives are mission moments answering, "What Would Jesus Do If He Was Me?"

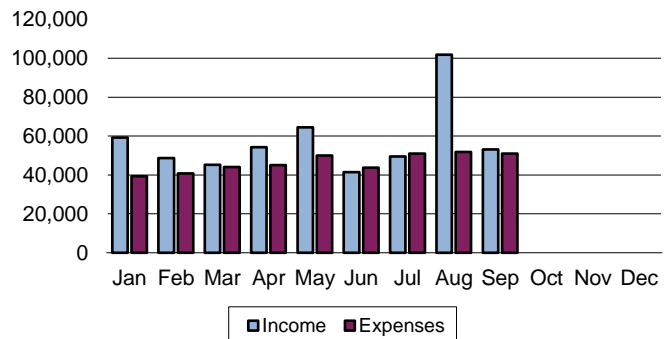

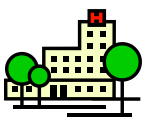


### General Fund 2021 Income vs. Expenses
