A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Beloveds of Our Saviour's,

I can't think of the month of November without thinking of Thanksgiving. As Christians, we are to be thankful people, indeed. As Lutherans, everything we do in life is in response to God's graciousness toward us. So, it is proper and appropriate that we have at least a day to pause, to reflect on, and to respond in thanksgiving to all that God has and continues to offer us.

Yes, at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church of Victoria, there are plenty of reasons for us to respond in joy, praise, and thanksgiving to God's graciousness this year. Take a moment right now and name three (3) things, <u>out loud</u>, about OSLC that you're grateful for this year. For me, among the many and numerous blessings of God I see this year, I am thankful for:

- 1. faith-filled and compassionate congregation members and volunteers,
- 2. response-able, loving and dedicated staff,

From the "Listening Post" Box, in the Narthex: As I promised in last month's newsletter, I will address here the questions/comments/suggestions/complaints that are received in the "Listening Post" box. There were two suggestions offered this month:

- 1. OSLC's name should be back in the Victoria Advocate paper, along with the other Lutheran Churches' ads.
- 2. Pastor La should visit our shut-ins every month and give Communion.

Regarding our Church name not appearing in the Saturday's newspaper ad, a year ago or so, the Church Council was presented the findings, that more people are likely to see, to read and to respond to our ads in electronic formats (via: billboards, social media, electronic signboard, etc.) these days than through the local newspaper. Thus, financially speaking and as good stewards of our resources, the Church Council unanimously decided to spend the annual \$2,300-some toward the electronic formats. I understand the interest and the desire to having our name in the newspaper because the other Lutherans are in it. However, realistically speaking, more people will see and know about us electronically than through the Victoria Advocate.

About the second suggestion, it will be my joy and pleasure to visit our shut-ins and homebound members. However, we have an entire ministry team and committee (*The Care & Bridging Ministry*, led by Larry Henneke) that are trained and scheduled to provide such needs at OSLC. Be that as it may, I have and I'm willing to go on visits with these faith team members, as time and schedule will allow.


### Thanksgiving Outreach Dinner November 19th





**Book of the Month for November:** You may recognize Philip Yancey as the author of such books as *The Jesus I Never Knew* and *How Thirteen Unlikely Mentors Helped My Faith Survive the Church.* This memoir, *Where The Light Fell*, is his memoir explaining how his very dysfunctional family impacted his life. Raised by an impoverished widow in Atlanta in the 1950s who earned room and board money as a Bible teacher. When Yancey was in college, he uncovered a shocking secret about his father's death—a secret that began to illuminate the motivations that

drove his mother to strident religious convictions and a belief that her sons had been born for a divine cause. This novel is a gripping family narrative set against a turbulent time in post-World War II America, shaped by the collision of Southern fundamentalism with the mounting pressures of the civil rights movement and sixties-era forces of social change. In piecing together his fragmented personal history and his search for redemption, Yancey gives testament to the enduring power of our hunger for truth, and the possibility of faith rooted in grace instead of fear.



Competition or Cooperation? Since the earliest days of the church, followers of Jesus have struggled with division and disunity, so it does not come as a surprise when we encounter it in the church today. It is common for me to visit a church and hear members speak with envy about what the other churches in their community are doing. And I get it: I have spent countless hours strategizing how my church could gain in "market share" so to speak! Too often we view our church in competition with others.

It is easy to see how this disunity and division must grieve God, especially the attitudes that seek gains for one congregation at the expense of another! But I also see that God may be at work in a mysterious way through our earthly divisions. I profess a Lutheran faith because I believe it to be faithful and true as I read scripture. But I also know faithful Methodists, Baptists, Catholics, Anglicans, and others who would earnestly say the same thing about their faith. And I do not think that it is God's desire that we lock ourselves in a room together until we have hashed out an agreed upon faith so that there would be just one church on earth! Instead, the diversity of the church might be a part of God's plan to reach the masses.

Christian author Ed Stetzer is famous for saying that it will take all kinds of churches to reach all kinds of people. And while I still hold to the truth of our Lutheran faith, Stetzer makes a point that is worth paying attention to. What if churches stopped viewing one another as competition? What if we started to see that together we are on the same team and each playing a different role towards a common goal? What if the prize to be won were the unchurched instead of the "other-churched?" What if Christian communities celebrated one another's kingdom victories instead of being jealous of them?

Truth is that even within the Lutheran church, and even within our own association of congregations, we can view other Lutheran churches as threats. And if our primary target audience is the people in the community who identify themselves as Lutherans then that might be true since the pool of Lutherans is growing smaller and smaller by the day! But if our primary target audience is the people in the community who do not yet follow Jesus, then there is an abundant supply!

Jesus promises that the harvest is plentiful and states that the workers are few. Both statements are true, but we cannot mistake one for another: Churches should not be in competition for a finite pool of Jesus' followers, whether Lutheran or not. Instead, churches are called to collaborate and celebrate the harvest-gathering, kingdom-building work of the whole church of Jesus Christ no matter what name or denomination is on the church sign. How might God be calling you and your church rethink your role in your community, especially in how you think of and relate to other congregations? I pray that we discover a unity of purpose even in our diversity of understanding as we move beyond competition to cooperation.


