This year, December 3rd, 2023, being the First Sunday of the season of Advent, marks the beginning of a new liturgical calendar year for us. This New Year celebration is not unique for us at OSL. It is true and the same across all Lutheran congregations throughout the globe. So, Happy and Blessed New Year to us all, indeed! May the love and the unfathomable grace of our Lord - being administered richly by the power of the Holy Spirit - guide, sustain, and

empower us all to love Him and our neighbors, as we've been commanded and expected to do, daily (Mark 12:29-31). Why? So that all will know that we are Jesus' disciples, children of the highest God, and heirs of the Kingdom of God. To this end, I invite and encourage you to add the following prayer into your daily devotions or into your morning prayer time. So, before you get on with your daily tasks and routines, pray thusly each day:

Lord, by the way that I walk, by the way that I talk, by the way that I think, by the way that I pray, in everything I do, I want to honor you, by the way I live this day. Amen.

Yes, the Advent season is one filled with the sense of anticipation. When I was a kid, waiting for Christmas drove me crazy. Anticipating the new toys I would enjoy on Christmas morning was more than I could take! I would utilize my best detective skills to figure out where Santa (aka: Mom & Dad) had hidden my presents. Upon finding the stash one year, I actually played with my new toys when my brother and I were home alone. Santa wasn't impressed.

Yes, the anticipation for Christmas is so great in our society today, that early in October stores were already promoting Christmas decorations. I think it's a disturbing trend, but as a cultural tidal wave, it's difficult for most preachers to try to fight it. The temptation is to avoid the season of preparation, Advent, and jump right into Christmas right after Thanksgiving. Over the four weeks of Advent we will attempt to stay true to the lectionary readings and still communicate with a culture clearly focused on Christmas on the second coming of Jesus and the arrival of the fullness of the Kingdom of God. I hope you'll join us in our anticipation of what the Lord our Father has in store for us this season and throughout this "New Year".

Speaking of anticipation, Ms. Susan Woodson, our CYF Director, has enrolled (online) at St. Paul's Lutheran Seminary, in Springfield, MN to pursue a Master of Divinity (M.Div.) degree and intends to be an ordained Lutheran pastor upon completion of her study. In anticipation of this new calling in her life, she has requested to take on additional leadership roles in our worship services, as part of her training, to lead ("drive") our worship services, and occasionally preach the Word. The Worship & Music Team have approved her request and she'll begin after the New Year. I will coach, guide and mentor her through her training. What a great honor it is to have one of our own prepare for the Lord's ministry. I believe she will be a great pastor and leader of the Lord's Church wherever the Holy Spirit will lead her. Advent: More Than a Countdown - As a kid, I LOVED Advent! Why? Because it was a countdown to the best day of the year in the minds of most kids: Christmas! Why? Because Christmas meant PRESENTS! What kid doesn't love getting to unwrap Christmas presents?!? As I have grown and matured (hopefully) I have come to realize that Advent is so much more than a countdown... it is an invitation to give the best gift of all: God's grace through Jesus.

Entering the season of Advent, we are reminded of the extraordinary gift of God's grace given in the advent or arrival of Emmanuel (God with us), Jesus. As we anticipate the Christmas celebration and reflect upon the gift of God's grace in sending His son, I can't help but take note of what I think is often overlooked: our call to share that grace with others. In the hustle and bustle of this season, be attentive to the opportunities that God gives you to be instruments of God's grace for others. How can you joyfully demonstrate the love of Jesus in your interactions with friends, family, neighbors, co-workers and even strangers? It could be as simple as extending a helping hand to a neighbor, showing kindness to a stranger, or speaking a word of encouragement. It may be through sharing the story of Christ's birth, offering a listening ear to someone going through a tough time, or extending forgiveness in Jesus' name. Pray each day for God to give you eyes to see the opportunities and the courage and power of the Holy Spirit to embrace them. I believe God will indeed answer your prayer and give you both!

This Advent, I pray that our lives can be a testament to the transformative power of grace, as we actively and intentionally extend God's love to a world in need. In 1 Peter 4:10 (CSB) we read, "*Based on the gift each one has received, use it to serve others, as good managers of the varied grace of God.*" Our faith calls for us to respond to God's grace by not just receiving it but also stewarding it by sharing it generously with a world that so desperately needs it.


