A WORD

FROM THE

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God. Do not conform to the pattern of this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind." (Rom. 12:1-2a)

On May 24th of this year, I completed my 59th trip around our sun, and I'm currently on my way to completing my 60th trip. As of late, I've been looking back and reflecting on all that I have seen, done, and experienced in almost six decades. For sure, I am in awe of the goodness, mercy, and grace of God in my life.

Now, I realize that compared to many of our members at Our Saviour's, being 59 years old is still considered "young". But the more I look back at my life and where I am today, I quickly realize that I am getting older and fast becoming like those men that I used to detest when I was in my thirties – fat and flabby, grouchy and stubborn, lethargic yet opinionated, loud and bombastic, don't care what others think, and unwilling to change or be changed from what I think is working for me. Are these the "normal" signs and hints of growing older? Am I once again experiencing a form of growing pains?

Well, as I continue to reflect on my aging process and growing pains, I stumbled upon a small devotional book that I picked up at an LCMC National Gathering (Convention), two years ago. The devotional booklet is entitled, "An Apple A Day", by Kent R. Hunter, with Tracee J. Swank. In this booklet I learned about Linda, who finally found a church with powerful preaching and teaching. What she was hearing was biblical, but soon she found herself uncomfortable. Why? Because what she heard and experienced were stretching her. The truth that she did not expect was that Biblical Truth helps you grow, and growth means change, and change is uncomfortable. I believe it was Mark Twain who said, "The only person who likes change is a baby with a wet diaper." Often, we don't change until we are uncomfortable!

So, what's the prescription for growing older and growing pains?

Well, it's important to remember that our God is more interested in our character than in our comfort. He is more committed to our eternal growth than our earthly satisfaction. So, embrace the growing pains, the changes, the discomforts, and ask God for help through them. Trust that he will give you the power to endure and the grace to remain faithful to him. In the process, we will learn that God can be trusted. If all Christians would let God grow them, we'd see two outcomes: more discomfort and a lot more spiritual fulfillment. Then, and only then, might we be transformed by the renewing of our minds and be the kinds of Christians that young people admire and aspire to become.

May God's blessings, protection, provisions, and powerful presence be with you throughout this summer – wherever His Holy Spirit leads and guides you. Amen.



Faith Over Fear ~ I am so excited for our Texas District Gathering July 25-26 in Victoria! This year's theme is "All in the Same Boat" based on the story of Jesus calming the sea in Mark 4:35-41. In this story, Jesus' disciples were crossing the Sea of Galilee when a great windstorm arose and began swamping the boat. Fear struck the disciples, but Jesus was sleeping through it all. The disciples woke Jesus up: "Teacher! Don't you care that we are going to die?" Jesus then got up, rebuked the wind and calmed the sea.


In life and ministry, we all face challenging "storms" both as disciples of Jesus and as communities of faith. In this *Mission Moment* series, we have been leaning into the hope we have in Jesus in times of trouble. First, we remembered that we are not alone: Jesus was in the boat with the disciples the entire time the storm raged and he is with us in our storms as well. Last month I pondered whether we had grown complacent and left Jesus alone to fall asleep. Hopefully it does not take a 9-1-1 emergency for us to call on Jesus and wake him up! Instead, we should seek a relationship with Jesus through the regular reading of scripture, prayer, worship, and service.

In this final article, we recall Jesus' actions and words once the disciples woke him in Mark 4:39-40: "He got up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Silence! Be still!' The wind ceased, and there was a great calm. Then he said to them, 'Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?" Here Jesus connects faith and fear: When you have faith in Jesus, you have nothing to fear. Our Lord says to his followers: Trust me; Count on me; I am with you; I am ultimately in control; I will shelter and protect you; Have faith over fear.

Many people confuse this to mean that God won't ever let bad things happen to good people, but that simply isn't true. Bad things do happen all the time as the result of living in a sinful and broken world. What this really means is that in the midst of the bad things... in the suffering and hardship... when the world seems to be spinning out of control: God is with us, to help us, to strengthen us, to give us hope and see us through the storm.

Jesus calls on his followers to have faith and be at peace; to trust and not be afraid. In John 6:33, Jesus tells his disciples: "I have told you these things so that in me you may have peace. You will have suffering in this world. Be courageous! I have conquered the world." When God is in control, he is working for our good and his glory, even through the hard things of life. As Paul writes in Romans 8:28: "We know that all things work together for the good of those who love God, who are called according to his purpose."
