




With that, the thankful woman reached into a bag and handed Eve a wrapped package. She had been standing at her old spot that morning, waiting, not for a handout, but for the people she recognized for having been kind to her so that she could give each of them a doughnut, with a smile.

If your last name begins with A-I please bring a dessert.



As always, I attended with eager anticipation for the opportunity to meet new friends in Christ, reconnect with others, and to listen and learn. This year's Gathering was held in Lakeville, Minnesota around the theme "Our Help and Hope." As always, it was an awesome experience to gather for worship, fellowship, education and inspiration.


This year's Gathering marked the 25th anniversary of our association. Some of the original leaders who forged LCMC's humble beginnings shared the story of the early days of our association.
